The terracotta ceramic sculpture by Sotteno Tiburcio of the Arbol de la Vid (Tree of Life) is a link to Mexican culture which was major influence on Cléa van der Grijn exhibition *Reconstructing Memory*. Tiburcio's splendid clay sculptures show scenes from Mexican history, the cycle of life and death, or The Nativity. The silkscreen by Karin Guisti also refers to the idea of death as does the formal painting by T.O. Colbaird.

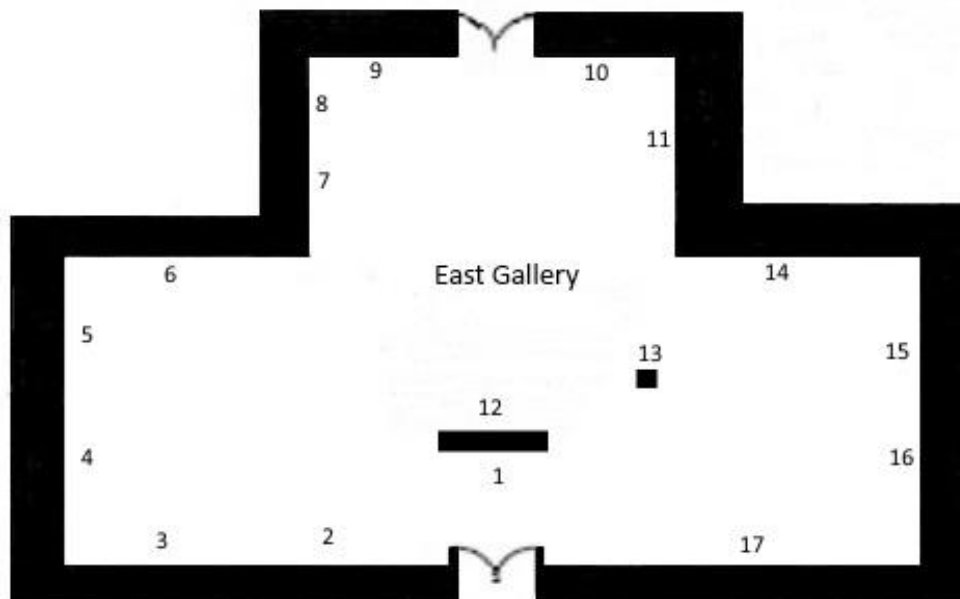
